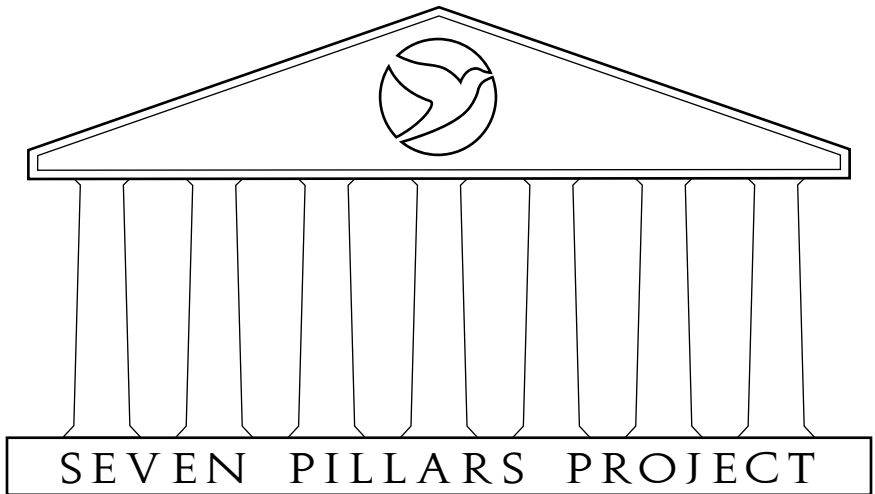

Zero to Eternity

Basics of Life

AA1) Zero to interaction

- *Zero-filter view of reality is required to make you and world better*
Rooms in wrong house; rebuild from foundation, start from zero
Find, not control, how universe works; obey or get crushed
False, limiting, popular beliefs hurt us and others
- *Zero is a fresh look at all the data without bias, dogma, filters*
Rockets explode so must start over, repeating is insanity
Mess of true, false, patches made for short term getting by
Rethink cultural norms, anti/religious dogma, family tradition
- *Zero is the lowest and easiest of all common ground*
All can easily choose to be learning children
- *Zero leads to completeness, consistency, creativity, discernment*
No incompleteness; big picture lets trivial details fade
No inconsistency; “nothing is certain”
Creativity has opportunity, like Edison’s light bulb
CCC leads to self-protecting belief system
- *Universal observations enable us to start at zero*
Globally verifiable raw data without needing filter
- *We observe that interactions are universal*
Talk, play, fly, swim, rain, wind, gravity, seeing, cycles
Stars, galaxies, atoms, molecules; find exception?
- *Physical interactions are caused by force, power*
- *Spiritual interactions are inspired by choice*
Body forced, but not spirit; attitudes, reactions chosen
Spiritual is not religious, but personal and essential
- *Interactions can be positive or negative*
Create/destroy; help/harm; take/give; kiss/fight; coop/compete

AA2) Faith, hope, and love

- *All choices are inspired by faith, hope, and love*
Marry; brush teeth; work; vacation; friends; ir/rational
Choice exists only where there is options
- *Faith, hope, and love can be positive or negative*
Disbelief often required, and is good when lack of evidence
Hate child’s cancer is good; hate evil is good
Self-centered; progress on others’ backs; love of destruction
- *Faith, hope, and love are category words*
- *Predictable patterns inspire faith*
Cry wolf almost forces; fulfillments grow, exceptions kill, faith
Shallow faith based on people, self, authorities
- *Progressive patterns inspire hope*
More candy on each floor; exploring mountains

Endless, infinite progress, not stasis, needed

◦ *Profitable patterns inspire love*

Feeling loved is feeling benefitted; stranger gives

Love gives because it trusts and hopes to receive

True love is doing what is eternally best for everyone

We are all loved on and through this home called Earth

◦ *Love can give in spite of negative patterns*

◦ *Our brains are pattern recognition machines*

Mother; language; culture; objects; processes

Different talents respond to different patterns

AA3) Infinite Good Person

◦ *Hope thrives only on infinity*

Anything less is an end and endings kill hope

◦ *Paradise instinct is our spiritual survival instinct for endless good*

Dry desert; burning house; invincibility of youth

Positive focus on quantity and quality of life

◦ *Good is what works forever, anything less is evil*

Mad hatters; sugar water; radium ladies; prisoner classes

Our ultimate desire is to have eternity of desirable experiences

◦ *Spiritual patterns are made only by spiritual people*

Can't buy; machine can't make; only people cure loneliness

◦ *Universe is uncreated, self-created, or created; so infinity*

◦ *Only an infinite good person can give us a good eternity*

All three ingredients are essential

◦ *4 miracles: nothing to law to something to life to mind*

Creative miracles are strong evidence of infinite ability

◦ *6 god options: good, evil, or mixed with finite or infinite*

◦ *Belief in a good God is reasonable, intuitive, and hopeful*

FHL, existence, miracles point to IGP which is most desirable

IGP is archetype, then eroded by cynicism and rebellion

◦ *Any God worth proving cannot be proved nor disproved*

Ingredients cannot be proved, but can be experienced

Proof kills FHL with supposed logical finality

Paradise instinct wants growing, endless patterns

Finding the Foundation

AB1) Filter religions for IGP and CCC patterns

- *Natural science is incapable of detecting the supernatural*
Measures data, cannot measure soul, God, love
- *All religions but 6 fail to teach an infinite good person*
Most teach finite being or infinite essence
- *General failure to teach CCC worldview for paradise instinct*
Tenrikyo, Zoroastrianism, Baha'i, Judaism, Islam, Christianity
- *Teaching of God's incarnation and sacrifice worth pursuing*
Unique story and evidence taught nowhere else
IGP who transcends divine glory and depths of human suffering
IGP who is able and willing to be with us and transform us
IGP who does whatever it takes to restore original perfection

AB2) We need revelation from God

- *Nature is contradictory and limited*
Life and death; pain and pleasure; creation and destruction
Inconsistent, finite spiritual experiences cannot explain infinity
- *Our experience is contradictory and limited*
Selfish and unselfish; helpful and harmful; right and wrong
We have no perfect example(s) to make proper judgments
- *Science is contradictory and limited*
Reasoning up from physical measurement cannot reach spiritual
Peer review and AI are as fallible and political as humans
- *Popular beliefs and leaders are fallible feedback loop*
Peer pressure and dependency
Universe ignores popular opinion, cultural norms
- *We need Infinity to explain infinite universe*
Only infinite good person can know eternally best options
Eternal truth must be miraculously communicated to us

AB3) The Bible claims to be a revelation from God

- *It teaches an IGP who satisfies our paradise instinct*
- *It is the only source that teaches God's soul sacrifice for us*
- *It teaches CCC work of redemption personally and globally*
- *It correctly prophesied rise of each empire and fall of the church*
- *It uses intelligent patterns that solve problems of human language*
- *Archaeology more and more confirms its history*
- *True followers have abundant peace unto death*
- *It is well documented and well translated*
- *It has survived centuries of attacks*
- *It records incomprehensible mysteries and miracles*

AB4) Bible patterns give us God's true meaning

- *Structure and purpose of Scripture*
Humans can no longer bear God's presence, speak His language

Written word is verifiable, accessible, transgenerational
Moses and Old Testament lead to Jesus Christ in New Testament

- *Translation problems exist at every communication junction*
No human can understand a word of God's perfect language
God speaks through minds to minds with human language
Bible offers imperfect living tree; critics offer shiny dead twigs
- *God speaks our language in life, nature, Scripture*
Experience, nature, and music teach without words
Communicating our learning requires words
- *Patterns of words help us get more accurate/flexible meaning*
Individual nuances are lost, but main point gets across
Progressive patterns interlock to build system

AB5) God is love is good is holy

Ecc 3:14) good is what lasts forever perfectly
Gen 1) behold it was very good
Deut 32:4) perfect, judgment, truth, without iniquity
Is 6:3) holy, holy, holy, is the Lord of hosts
Mt 5:48) your Father which is in heaven is perfect
Jn 17:25) Father is righteous
Jam 1:17) Father of lights, with whom is no variableness
1Jn 1:5) God is light, and in him is no darkness at all
1Jn 4:8-16) God is love
Rev 4:8) holy, holy, holy
Rev 15:3-4) just and true are Your ways; all nations will worship
Rev 21:4) only good in the end: no more tears, pain, death

AB6) God created the universe

Gen 1:1) in the beginning God created the heaven and the earth
Gen 5:1-2) in the day that God created them
Ps 33:6) by the word of the LORD were the heavens made
Ps 148:5) He commanded, and they were created
Is 40:26) behold who has created these, He calls them by name
Is 42:5) He that created the heavens, and stretched them out
Is 43:1-7) I have created him for My glory
Is 45:12) I have made the earth, and created man upon it
Is 45:18) He created it not in vain, He formed it to be inhabited
Is 65:17) I create new heavens and a new earth
Eze 28:15) you were perfect from the day you were created

Ps 147:16) He gives snow. He scatters frost.
Is 40:26) He is strong in power, not one fails
Jer 10:13) He causes vapor to ascend. He makes lightning.
Jn 5:17) My Father works now, and I work
Acts 17:28) in Him we live and move and have our being
Rom 1:20) eternal power and Godhead clearly seen in world
Col 1:17) by Him all things exist
Rev 4:11) were and are created; have their being

AB8) Three types of evil

◦Primary evil choice

Gen 3:6) sin entered earth through non-spiritual choice
Jn 8:44) devil chose not to abide in truth, so father of sin
Rom 13:10; 1Jn 3:4) sin is transgression of the law of love
Jam 1:13-15) sin comes from choice results in death

◦Secondary evil effects

Gen 3:14-24; Rom 8:18-21) subjected to vanity for hope
Prov 26:2) curse causeless shall not come
Is 28:21; 45:7) strange, but just, act to cause pain and defeat
Rom 6:23) wages of sin is death
Gal 6:7) whatsoever a man sows that shall he also reap

◦Residual influence

2Sam 15:1-6) Absalom steals the hearts of Israel
2Sam 19:9-14) David requests, not forces, support
Eccl 8:11) sentence delayed so men fully set to do evil
Jn 1:46) can any good thing come out of Nazareth?
Jn 12:31; Rev 12:7-12) 4000 years for angels to oust devils
Act 9:13) Ananias thinks Saul is still a murderer

AB9) God will repair the universe

Gen 3:15) Seed will bruise serpent's head
Ps 106:21) they forgot God their Savior
Ps 37:29) righteous shall inherit the land and live forever
Is 11:9) not hurt nor destroy in all My holy mountain
Is 19:18-25) He shall send them a Savior and deliver them
Is 43:1-13) I have redeemed you, beside Me there is no Savior
Is 45:16-25) Earth not created in vain, He is its only Savior
Is 49:26; 60:16) all flesh shall know that I am your Savior

Is 53:11) He shall see the travail of his soul and be satisfied

AB10) Proper Bible study is powerful

Is 28:9-13) meditate on each verse to gain helpful thought
Is 8:19-20; Mt 4:4) Jesus trusted it when tempted
Eccl 1:10; Mt 13:52) new builds on old
Lk 10:26) read personally for salvation
Lk 24:27) all scriptures come from Him and point to Him
Jn 1:14) Word made flesh/paper, but we behold His glory
Act 17:11) study daily with readiness of mind
1Cor 2:10-16) comparing spiritual things with spiritual
2Tim 3:15-17) all scripture inspired, so consistent teaching
2Pt 1:17-21) no scripture is of any private interpretation

AC2) Soul sacrifice of Christ

◦ *Three hours*

Lk 23:34, 39-43; Jn 19:25-27) before the 3 dark hours
Lk 23:44; Mt 27:45; Mk 15:33) the 3 dark hours
Lk 23:48-49) after all are far away, Jesus talks only to God
2Pt 3:8) 3 hours can be 3 trillion years

◦ *Three examples Christ must fulfill*

Gen 22:9-13) Abraham not allowed to sacrifice Isaac
Ex 32:30-33) Moses not allowed to sacrifice his eternity
Deut 21:22-23; Gal 3:13) hung on tree is second death

◦ *Three psalms*

Ps 22) forsaken, reproached, pierced, hated without cause
Ps 69) restored, zeal, reproached, vinegar
Ps 88) shut up and cannot come forth, cast off soul

◦ *Three soul verses*

Is 53:10) You shall make His soul an offering for sin
Is 53:11) He shall see of the travail of His soul
Is 53:12) He has poured out His soul unto death

◦ *Christ gave body and soul, physical life and eternal life*

AC4) Soul exchange in Christ

◦ *Christ is the kingdom of heaven and the only way into it*

Mt 9:17) Christ is new wine makes old heart new
Mt 13:1-33) Christ is seed and leaven in the heart
Mt 13:31-33) Christ is mustard seed and leaven
Mt 18:1-4) humble children, not great adults, enter into Christ
Jn 15:1-11) branch must be in Vine and Vine in branch

◦ *Christ is new living spirit in old body*

Rom 3:24) redemption is in Christ
Rom 8:9-14) in the flesh is death but in the Spirit is life
1Cor 1:2) church is set apart in Christ
1Cor 1:30) Christ is our wisdom, righteousness, redemption
1Cor 15:22) in Adam all die, in Christ shall all be made alive
2Cor 1:21-22) established, anointed, sealed in Christ
2Cor 5:17) in Christ we become new creature
Eph 1:3) blessed with all spiritual blessings in Christ
Eph 1:20-23) church is filled with Him that fills all in all

feet that were of iron and clay, and broke them to pieces. Then

was the iron, the clay, the brass, the silver, and the gold, broken

to pieces together, and became like the chaff of the summer

threshing floors; and the wind carried them away, that no place

was found for them: and the stone that smote the image became

a great mountain, and filled the whole earth. This is the dream;

and we will tell the interpretation of it...” (v29-36)

BC3) Daniel 2– Explanation

[1] “You O king, are a king of kings: for the God of heaven has

given you a kingdom, power, and strength, and glory. And

wherever the children of men dwell, the beasts of the field and

the fowls of the heaven has he given into your hand, and has

made you ruler over them all. You are this head of gold. [2] And after you shall arise another kingdom inferior to you [3] and another third kingdom of brass, which shall bear rule over all the earth. [4U] And the fourth kingdom shall be strong as iron: just as iron breaks in pieces and subdues all things: and as iron that breaks all these, shall it break in pieces and bruise. [4D] And like as you saw the feet and toes, part of potters' clay, and part of iron, the kingdom shall be divided; but there shall be in it of the strength of the iron, just as you saw the iron mixed with miry clay. And as the toes of the feet were part of iron, and part of clay, so the kingdom shall be partly strong, and partly broken. And like as you saw iron mixed with miry clay, they shall mingle themselves with the seed of men: but they shall not cling one to another, even as iron is not mixed with clay. [G] And in the days of these kings shall the God of heaven set up a kingdom, which shall never be destroyed: and the kingdom shall not be left to other people, but it shall break in pieces and consume all these kingdoms, and it shall stand for ever. Just as you saw that the stone was cut out of the mountain without hands, and that it broke in pieces the iron, the brass, the clay, the silver, and the gold; the great God has made known to the king what shall come to pass hereafter: and the dream is certain, and the interpretation of it sure." (Daniel 2:37-45)

BC8) Daniel 7– Vision

I saw in my vision by night, and, behold, the four winds of the heaven strove upon the great sea. And four great beasts came up from the sea, different one from another. **[1]** The first was like a lion, and had eagle's wings: I beheld until the wings of it were plucked, and it was lifted up from the earth, and made stand upon the feet as a man, and a man's heart was given to it.

[2] And behold another beast, a second, like to a bear, and it raised up itself on one side, and it had three ribs in the mouth of it between the teeth of it: and they said thus unto it, Arise, devour much flesh. **[3]** After this I beheld, and lo another, like a leopard, which had upon the back of it four wings of a fowl; the

beast had also four heads; and dominion was given to it. **[4U]**

After this I saw in the night visions, and behold a fourth beast, dreadful and terrible, and strong exceedingly; and it had great iron teeth: it devoured and broke in pieces, and stamped the residue with the feet of it: and it was different from all the beasts that were before it; **[4D]** and it had ten horns. I

considered the horns, and, behold, there came up among them another little horn, before whom there were three of the first horns plucked up by the roots: and, behold, in this horn were eyes like the eyes of man, and a mouth speaking great things.

[S] I beheld until the thrones were cast down, and the Ancient of days did sit, whose garment was white as snow, and the hair

of his head like the pure wool: his throne was like the fiery flame, and his wheels as burning fire. A fiery stream issued and came forth from before him: thousand thousands ministered unto him, and ten thousand times ten thousand stood before him: the judgment was set, and the books were opened. I beheld then because of the voice of the great words which the horn spoke, I beheld even until the beast was slain, and his body destroyed, and given to the burning flame. As concerning the rest of the beasts, they had their dominion taken away: yet their lives were prolonged for a season and time. I saw in the night visions, and, behold, one like the Son of man came with the clouds of heaven, and came to the Ancient of days, and they brought him near before him. And there was given him dominion, and glory, and a kingdom, that all people, nations, and languages, should serve him: his dominion is an everlasting dominion, which shall not pass away, and his kingdom that which shall not be destroyed.” (v1-14)

BC9) Daniel 7– Explanation

“I Daniel was grieved in my spirit in the midst of my body, and the visions of my head troubled me. I came near unto one of them that stood by, and asked him the truth of all this. So he told me, and made me know the interpretation of the things. **[1-4]** These great beasts, which are four, are four kings, which shall arise out of the earth. **[G]** But the saints of the most High shall take the kingdom, and possess the kingdom for ever, even for ever and ever. **[4U]** Then I would know the truth of the fourth beast, which was different from all the others, exceeding dreadful, whose teeth were of iron, and his nails of brass; which devoured, broke in pieces, and stamped the residue with his feet; **[4D]** And of the ten horns that were in his head, and of the other which came up, and before whom three fell; even of that horn that had eyes, and a mouth that spoke very great things, whose look was more stout than his fellows. I beheld, and the same horn made war with the saints, and prevailed against them; **[G]** Until the Ancient of days came, and judgment was given to the saints of the most High; and the time came that the saints possessed the kingdom. **[4U]** Thus he said, The fourth beast shall be the fourth kingdom upon earth, which shall be different from all kingdoms, and shall devour the whole earth, and shall tread it down, and break it in pieces. **[4D]** And the ten horns out of this kingdom are ten kings that shall arise: and another shall rise after them; and he shall be different from the first, and he shall subdue three kings. And he shall speak great words against the most High, and shall wear out the saints of

the most High, and think to change times and laws: and they shall be given into his hand until a year and years and the dividing of a year. [S] But the judgment shall sit, and they shall take away his dominion, to consume and to destroy it unto the end. [G] And the kingdom and dominion, and the greatness of the kingdom under the whole heaven, shall be given to the people of the saints of the most High, whose kingdom is an everlasting kingdom, and all dominions shall serve and obey him. Here is the end of the matter. As for me Daniel, my cogitations much troubled me, and my appearance changed in me: but I kept the matter in my heart.” (v15-28)

BC10) Daniel 8– Vision

[2] Then I lifted up my eyes, and saw, and, behold, there stood before the river a ram which had two horns: and the two horns were high; but one was higher than the other, and the higher came up last. I saw the ram pushing westward, and northward, and southward; so that no beasts might stand before him, neither was there any that could deliver out of his hand; but he did according to his will, and became great. [3] And as I was considering, behold, a he-goat came from the west on the face of the whole earth, and touched not the ground: and the goat had a notable horn between his eyes. And he came to the ram that had two horns, which I had seen standing before the river, and ran unto him in the fury of his power. And I saw him come close unto the ram, and he was moved with anger against him, and smote the ram, and broke his two horns: and there was no power in the ram to stand before him, but he cast him down to the ground, and stamped upon him: and there was none that could deliver the ram out of his hand. Therefore the he-goat grew very great: and when he was strong, the great horn was broken; and for it came up four notable ones toward the four winds of heaven. [4] And out of one of them came forth a little horn, which grew exceeding great, toward the south, and toward the east, and toward the pleasant land. And it grew great, even to the host of heaven; and it cast down some of the host and of the stars to the ground, and stamped upon them. Yea, he magnified himself even to the prince of the host, and by him the daily sacrifice was taken away, and the place of his sanctuary was cast down. And a host was given him against the daily sacrifice by reason of transgression, and it cast down the truth to the ground; and it practiced and prospered. [S] Then I heard one saint speaking, and another saint said unto that certain saint which spoke, How long shall be the vision concerning the daily sacrifice, and the transgression of

desolation, to give both the sanctuary and the host to be trodden under foot? And he said unto me, Unto two thousand and three hundred days; then shall the sanctuary be cleansed.” (v1-14)

BC11) Daniel 8– Explanation

“And it came to pass, when I, even I Daniel, had seen the vision, and sought for the meaning, then, behold, there stood before me as the appearance of a man. And I heard a man's voice between the banks of Ulai, which called, and said, Gabriel, make this man to understand the vision. So he came near where I stood: and when he came, I was afraid, and fell upon my face: but he said unto me, Understand, O son of man: for at the time of the end shall be the vision. Now as he was speaking with me, I was in a deep sleep on my face toward the ground: but he touched me, and set me upright. And he said, Behold, I will make you know what shall be in the last end of the indignation: for at the time appointed the end shall be. [2] The ram which you saw having two horns are the kings of Media and Persia. [3] And the rough goat is the king of Grecia: and the great horn that is between his eyes is the first king. Now that being broken, just as four stood up for it, four kingdoms shall stand up out of the nation, but not in his power. [4] And in the latter time of their kingdom, when the transgressors are come to the full, a king of fierce countenance, and understanding dark sentences, shall stand up. And his power shall be mighty, but not by his own power: and he shall destroy wonderfully, and shall prosper, and practice and shall destroy the mighty and the holy people. And through his policy also he shall cause craft to prosper in his hand; and he shall magnify himself in his heart, and by peace shall destroy many: he shall also stand up against the Prince of princes; but he shall be broken without hand. [5] And the vision of the evening and the morning which was told is true: wherefore shut you up the vision; for it shall be for many days. And I Daniel fainted, and was sick certain days; afterward I rose up, and did the king's business; and I was astonished at the vision, but none understood it.” (v15-27)

“And I prayed unto the LORD my God, and **made my confession**, and said, O Lord, the great and dreadful God, keeping the covenant and mercy to them that love him, and to them that keep his commandments; **We have sinned, and have committed iniquity, and have done wickedly, and have rebelled, even by departing from your precepts and from your judgments: Neither have we listened unto your servants the prophets, which spoke in your name to our**

kings, our princes, and our fathers, and to all the people of the land. O LORD, righteousness belongs unto you **but unto us confusion of faces, as at this day; to the men of Judah, and to the inhabitants of Jerusalem, and unto all Israel, that are near, and that are far off, through all the countries where you have driven them, because of their trespass that they have trespassed against you. As it is written in the law of Moses, all this evil is come upon us: yet made we not our prayer before the LORD our God, that we might turn from our iniquities, and understand your truth. Therefore has the LORD watched upon the evil, and brought it upon us: for the LORD our God is righteous in all his works which he does for **we obeyed not his voice.** And now, O Lord our God, that have brought your people forth out of the land of Egypt with a mighty hand, and have gotten you fame as at this day; **we have sinned, we have done wickedly.** O LORD, according to all your righteousness, I beg you let your anger and your fury be turned away from your city Jerusalem, your holy mountain: **because for our sins, and for the iniquities of our fathers, Jerusalem and your people are become a reproach to all that are about us.** Now therefore, O our God, hear the prayer of your servant, and his supplications, and cause your face to shine upon **your sanctuary that is desolate**, for the Lord's sake. O my God, incline your ear, and hear; open your eyes, and **behold our desolations**, and the city which is called by your name: for we do not present our supplications before you for our righteousnesses, but for your great mercies. O Lord, hear; O Lord, forgive; O Lord, listen and do; defer not, for your own sake, O my God: for your city and your people are called by your name.” (v1-19)**

BC13) Daniel 9– Seventy weeks

“Yea, while I was speaking in prayer, even the man Gabriel, whom I had seen in the vision at the beginning, being caused to fly swiftly, touched me about the time of the evening oblation. And he informed me, and talked with me, and said, O Daniel, I am now come forth to give you skill and understanding. At the beginning of your supplications the commandment came forth, and I am come to show you for you are greatly beloved: therefore understand the matter, and consider the vision.

²⁴ Seventy weeks are determined upon your people and upon your holy city, to finish the transgression, and to make an end of sins, and to make reconciliation for iniquity, and to bring in everlasting righteousness, and to seal up the vision and prophecy, and to anoint the most Holy.

²⁵ Know therefore and understand, that from the going forth of the commandment to restore and to build Jerusalem unto the Messiah the Prince shall be seven weeks, and sixty and two weeks: the street shall be built again, and the wall, even in troublous times.

²⁶ And after sixty and two weeks shall Messiah be cut off, but not for himself: and the people of the prince that shall come shall destroy the city and the sanctuary; and the end of it shall be with a flood, and unto the end of the war desolations are determined.

²⁷ And he shall confirm the covenant with many for one week: and in the midst of the week he shall cause the sacrifice and the oblation to cease, and for the overspreading of abominations he shall make it desolate, even until the consummation, and that determined shall be poured upon the desolate.” (v21-27)

$2300 - 457 + 1 = 1844$ (no zero year) This means Jesus was born about 4BC and baptized about 27AD.

There are no missing years, dates, or numbers. Instead of sliding the calendar, historians slide Christ's birthdate.

History

BF1) What happened in 457BC?

Of the three recorded decrees by Persian kings, only the one by Artaxerxes I gave permission to rebuild and govern Jerusalem in addition to rebuilding the temple. Correlations between the Persian and Jewish calendars clearly date the decree in 457.

BF2) When was Jesus born?

There is not enough historical evidence to pinpoint the birthdate of Jesus. However, it can be shown He was born in 4 or 5BC.

That would then put Christ's baptism at 27AD in harmony with the beginning of the 70th week of Daniel 9. It would also be in harmony with a crucifixion date of 31AD, which also cannot be proven from history alone with more precision than about one year. Therefore, while there is not historical proof on the dates, they are reasonably supported.

BF3) What happened from 303 to 313?

The Diocletianic or Great Persecution was the last and most severe persecution of Christians in the Roman Empire. It ended with the Edict of Milan which gave Christianity legal status.

BF4) What happened in 508?

The Franks (predecessors to France) converted to Roman Catholicism about 500AD. Under the leadership of Clovis, they destroyed the Visigoth (Arian heretics) kingdom in Aquitaine, by 508. A church-state amalgamation was then formed which lasted until the French Revolution in the 1790's.

BF5) What happened in 476?

Odoacer, an Arian (heretic) Christian, led Germanic soldiers from northern Europe against Rome and deposed Romulus Augustulus on September 4, 476. The Roman empire to the east, also called Byzantine, survived. Until 538, Arian tribes would rule in Rome.

BF6) What happened in 538?

Shortly before 538, Justinian, the Roman emperor in the east, had made a set of laws called the Justinian Code. This code gave power over the western empire to the leader of the Roman Catholic church, the pope. However, Pope John II could not rule from Rome until Justinian's general, Belisarius, took the city from the Arian tribes in 538. From that time forward, the pope had a political seat as well as a religious seat.

BF7) What happened on July 27, 1299?

Ottomans defeat Byzantines at battle of Bapheus, which was the beginning of the end for the Byzantines.

BF8) What happened on January 6, 1449?

The last Byzantine emperor was crowned after requesting authorization from the Ottoman sultan.

BF9) What happened on August 11, 1840?

The submission of the Ottoman sultan to the powers of Europe.

BF10) What happened in 1798?

Napoleon's general, Berthier, marched his army into Rome with the support of most of its population. He deposed, then imprisoned or banished, all of the church leadership, including Pope Pius VI. Furthermore, the French Civil Code replaced the Justinian Code and the power of the church over the state was completely broken.

BF11) What happened in 1844?

Of all the great religious movements since the days of the apostles, none have been more free from human imperfection and the wiles of Satan than was that of the autumn of 1844. Even now, after the lapse of many years, all who shared in that movement and who have stood firm upon the platform of truth still feel the holy influence of that blessed work and bear witness that it was of God. (Great Controversy, 401)

(not to scale)

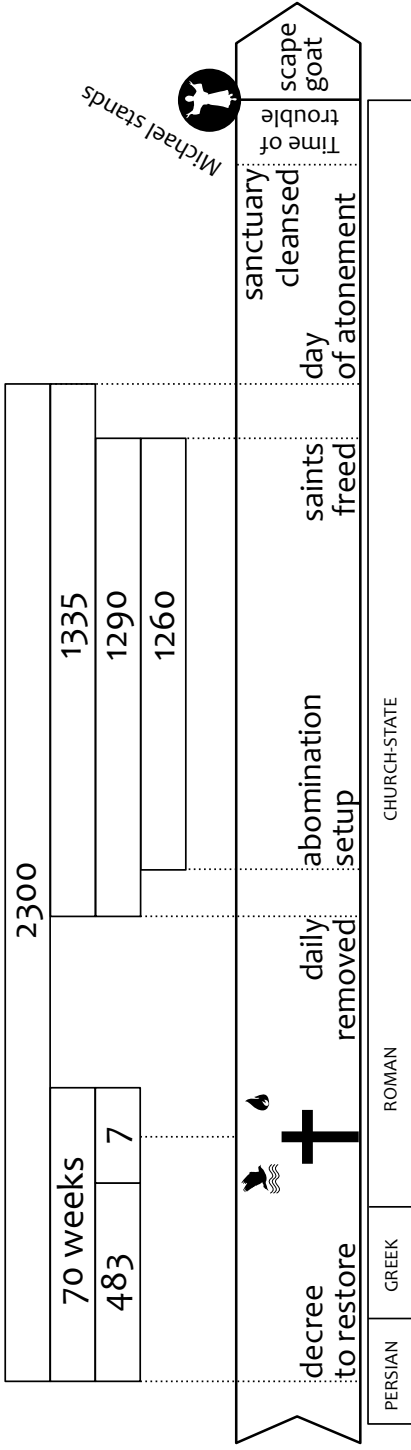
